

# **Neolithic Studies Group Spring Meeting**

## **Dumfries and Galloway, South West Scotland**

# 10-12 May 2019

This year's Spring Meeting will take place in south west Scotland, starting on the evening of Friday 10th May and concluding mid-afternoon on Sunday 12th May. The meeting will be based in Kirkcudbright, a small and picturesque town on the Solway coast, well-known for its fine medieval castle and elegant townhouses, and much favoured by generations of creative artists and writers. On Friday evening, the Selkirk Arms Hotel will play host to some short introductory talks where a finger buffet will be served with tea and coffee (<a href="https://www.selkirkarmshotel.co.uk/">https://www.selkirkarmshotel.co.uk/</a>). The following morning, we will depart from Kirkcudbright and head west beginning our site visits at Dunragit then going to Mid Gleniron chambered cairns and the standing stones and cup and ring markings at Drumtroddan before stopping for lunch in Wigtown. In the afternoon we plan to visit Torhousekie stone circle and walk off our lunch with a stroll through forestry plantations to Bargrennan chambered cairn. We aim to return to Kirkcudbright by 6pm providing enough time for everyone to relax/explore the town and change for dinner. We have arranged a fixed price dinner menu at the Selkirk Arms Hotel and if you'd like to join us, please let us know on the attached booking form; of course, you are welcome to make your own supper arrangements. On Sunday, we will visit the chambered cairns at Cairnholy then head east towards Dumfries to see the Twelve Apostles stone circle and consider the landscape setting of the adjacent Holywood cursus, visible only as cropmarks from the air. The group will then disband.

We plan to travel together by coach on Saturday and by pooling available cars on Sunday. For those not traveling by car, it may be possible to collect/drop off in Dumfries. To this end, it would be really useful if you could provide an indication of your travel arrangements on the attached booking form.

Dumfries and Galloway is a remarkably large area and the landscape combines rugged mountains and moorland with gentle undulating pastures, a rocky shoreline and sandy beaches. Most of the sites we will visit are easily accessible on foot though a small number will involve walking along rough tracks and across unimproved ground so a reasonable level of fitness will be required. The weather here can also change very quickly, so be prepared for all eventualities and bring your walking boots and waterproofs as well as sun block and midge repellent.

Cost will be £40 and is based on a group of 25. This cost covers the buffet and talks on Friday evening and coach travel on the Saturday.

Numbers are restricted to 25 - so first come, first served!
